Ask anybody who has watched a fencing competition in recent years “ who is Nick Liefting?” and guarantee the answer will be “ that fast old guy over there!”

Nick’s endearing personality has been a big part of fencing competitions for the last 40 years and has given the sport great publicity.

He is well respected and around the world for his string of impressive titles including one World Fencing championship title, 2 Golden Pliers wins, 4 Silver Spades titles, 29 first off the line titles, 37 Golden Pliers finals, as well as multiple titles for the fastest times in the heats and finals at National Championship level.

Nick has had a valued involvement in NZFC from its early conception days, and has been a vital committee member with a depth of knowledge and skills to offer to the organization and fencing competitions in general. He has also single handedly taken on the role of curator of our Hall of Fame.

Following his retirement from competitive fencing in 2016, Nick’s passion for the sport saw him publish a book named “The Golden Pliers” , a history of New Zealand’s Premier farm fencing competition. With no previous experience in creating a book, Nick set out with a clear vision and proceeded to physically interview all of the past winners to obtain their story, compiled the material, employed a photographer, requested endorsements and sourced a publisher.

With the backing of prominent rural figures like Sir William Gallagher and Peter Nations, as well as other industry bodies, the book is not only a keepsake, but also a vivid insight into the lives, families and communities of every Golden Pliers winner there has ever been.

It is a much admired account of the last 45 years of fencing competitions in our country.

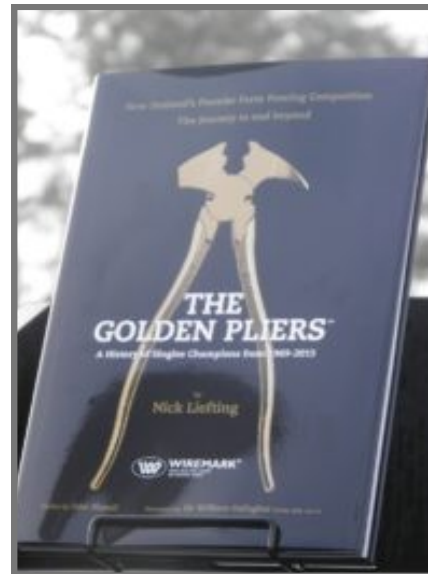
